WOUT BERGER / MIKE BRODIE

Berger, a Dutch photographer interested in the interdependence of man and nature, shows large-scale images of greenhouses, a hyacinth harvest, and wildflowers and weeds sprouting in sandy fields, the last of which invite total sensory immersion. Even more inviting are the twenty-one-year-old Brodie's little Polaroids of friends and acquaintances made in the course of cross-country road trips. Perhaps because Brodie is from Florida and his subjects are mostly from the South, his pictures recall Walker Evans and William Eggleston, but there's something a lot more soulful and intimate here, especially in his images of children. His New York debut, modest but never tentative, marks him as someone to watch. Through March 10. (Benrubi, 41 E. 57th St. 212-888-6007.)
